

● **Project progress**

The development activities aimed at transforming the Frischgewaagd-Ledig project into the next major PGM mine in the Bushveld Complex are well underway.

The critical-path work packages completed over the last year include terracing, fencing, pollution control dams, box cuts on the shafts and the winder house foundation. We have also completed the Eskom substation terrace, ducting for high tension cables, site offices have been assembled, and we are busy with water and power reticulation to offices.

TWP was appointed as the EPCM contractor from July 2011 to June 2012 and the remaining civil earthworks and concrete work was awarded to Scribante and Livero. The shaft sinking enquiry has been issued and the first proposals have been received. We expect that a successful contractor will be notified in January 2012, and the start of the pre-sinking on the ventilation shaft is scheduled for May 2012. Wesizwe will supervise the recruitment and procurement commitment of all contractors for our social and labour plan.

With the deposit paid to Eskom, the phase power supply programme has started and contractors have been appointed for the substation work. Wesizwe has secured a 2Mva power supply that will be increased to 8Mva, which is sufficient for the requirements of the 60-month sinking activities.

Wesizwe is also in discussion with other private applicants, including neighbour companies, to explore the synergies for bulk water supply to the area. Wesizwe already has supply commitment of 200 000l per day of water, which is sufficient for the shaft construction over the next five years.



● **Investor road show**

To further enhance communications with its stakeholders, particularly current and potential investors in Wesizwe, directors and management undertook a road show in Johannesburg and Cape Town in November, sharing with key institutional shareholders progress on the Frischgewaagd-Ledig mine development plans which underpin the key objectives of creating value for shareholders in an environmentally responsible and sustainable manner, based on long-term relationships with governments and local communities. Jacob Mogale Mthomogolo**

Jacob Mthomogolo, who joined Wesizwe in May 2011, sums up his role at Wesizwe in one succinct sentence: "to maximise value in the company's projects for all its stakeholders." And for now, his focus is squarely on the Frischgewaagd-Ledig complex.



Jacob is not a newcomer to the project. Before joining the Company as an employee Jacob was the senior project manager at TWP responsible for the Wesizwe mine development project.

Jacob is a qualified mining engineer who obtained his degree through an Anglo American scholarship. He started his mining career in the Welkom gold mines where he experienced the production environment before moving into middle management. "As one of the largest mining companies in China, Jinchuan has tremendous experience in mining and processing which, with the proper transfer of skills, will benefit Wesizwe hugely," shares Jacob.

**Community Open Day**

A healthy relationship with the host community – and, in our case, a shareholder in the Company – is critical for the successful development of a mine, and it is in the Company's best interests to work within a fully functioning, clearly defined and stable community structure.

Wesizwe has implemented a number of initiatives to facilitate open dialogue with its surrounding community. These include conducting a perception survey, establishing a formal "complaints and suggestions" process, and the appointment of a community liaison officer who manages an office in the community. In October the Company launched a formal Stakeholder Engagement Forum as a platform for information sharing and feedback on mine-related activity.

Community members were given the opportunity to visit information stands and speak to senior Wesizwe management to understand what is involved in building the mine and what opportunities will be available as mine construction takes off.
